




Location A city in Western Perak, Malaysia. Situated in the Southwest of the Malay Peninsula, approximately 48km Northwest of Ipoh. Area 186.5km² Population 191,104 Climate Tropical wet climate, hot and humid throughout the year with an average annual temperature of 27°C. During the wet season, from October to February, average temperature and humidity is higher, with regular rainfall. Overview Capital of Perak state and city of commerce, renowned for tin mines in the 19th century. Highways and railways in the West of Malay Peninsula cut across the city. Located approximately 20km inland from the coastal lowlands, embraced by Mount Hijau (1,448m). Back in the days, the city flourished as the center of the Kinta Valley, backed by an abundance of tin mines.

Bukit Larut

The highest highland in Taiping located 1035m above sea level. Bukit Larut was first discovered by William Edward Maxwell in 1884. After coming across this beautiful landmark, Maxwell created a hiking trail and constructed a resort near the peak. For this reason, Bukit Larut was once nicknamed 'Maxwell Hill.' The resort can be found at 1250m high, which makes it Malaysia's oldest accommodation at the summit of a mountain. The distance from the entrance to the peak is 13km. Some adventurous hikers attempt to climb the mountain on foot, but it is highly recommended that

Wildlife paradise Zoo Taiping

Malaysia's first-ever zoo. It has such a reputation that Taiping is most often associated with this particular landmark. The vast size of 140,000m² as well as the zoo's priority policy on zero-stress for the animals drew attention. Unlike a typical zoo, this landmark does not feature animal shows. Animals can be stressed most while trained for shows. Animal habitats in the Zoo are very similar to their wild habitat. The 'Savanna' section looks exactly like a reallife savanna, where giraffes, zebras and ostriches freely mingle together. The zoo also tried to minimize the use of fences, nets and glass walls and kept them at low heights so that humans and animals could be close to each other as possible. Visitors get to play with, and not just observe the animals. Local animals such as Malaysian tigers and orangutans, as well as 150 Asian and African animals and birds inhabit the zoo. The zoo is so large that motorized carts are available here and there. Strolling in the zoo is a good idea, but on a sweltering hot day you had better go around on the cart. Situated in the vicinity of the downtown, it is easy accessible to the zoo.

The name, meaning 'a city of eternal peace,' cannot be more fitting when looking at the pristine nature and kind-hearted locals. The former tin-mining city in 19c, once controlled by the British army, has a history of glory and shame. This turbulent history blessed the city with a great amount of charming versatility.







Malaysia's history at a glance

Perak Museum

Malaysia's oldest museum constructed in 1883. The museum has the personal collection of Hugh Low, a British who was a resident in Perak, on display, as well as the artifacts, cultural heritage, and taxidermied animals from all over Malaysia. The exhibition hall is divided into 4 sections: the nature gallery, cultural gallery, indigenous people gallery and outdoor gallery. The nature gallery features taxidermy of Perak jungle animals including elephants and tigers. The cultural gallery encapsulates everything about Malaysia's unique handcrafted artifacts, from different types to their historical development. Make sure to pay particular attention to the bamboo crafts, Perak's signature items. The indigenous people gallery tells a story about the ethnic minority, 'Orang Asli.' Their physical characteristics, lifestyle and commonly used exotic masks are exhibited in this hall. Exit through the back door, you will see the Perak Museum outdoor gallery. Here, you can feel a waft of history from the classic cars that roamed the streets in the 1920s~70s, 19c steam engines, and Malaysian fighter aircrafts on display.



Ho Chi Minh City is the largest city in Vietnam, where pure white French-style architectures glisten under the warm sunlight, and parks bustle with people enjoying the pleasant weather. The roads are always flooded with motorbikes honking 24/7, and women dressed in the traditional attire, the áo dài, roam the streets lined with modern skyscrapers. Let us embark on a journey to Ho Chi Minh City, where an exotic cityscape meets everyday life.

Location Southern Vietnam Area 2095km² Population 7,396,446 (as of 2010) Climate Tropical monsoon climate. Average temperature ranges from 25°C to 40°C. The wet season continues from May to November, and the dry season from December to April. Overview Vietnam's economic hub. The urban area is 13 existing districts and 6 districts to be developed additionally, and the city is also divided into the industrial district including Cu Chi and Nha Bê, the ecotourism district such as the Cân Gio mangrove forest and Đông Nai river area, agricultural and ecological conservation districts including Cu Chi and Cân Gio, agricultural/residential areas, and nature conversation districts.



Symbol of Ho Chi Minh City Uy Ban Nhan Dan Thanh Pho

A 19c architecture nicknamed 'Paris in Asia'. This elegant and exuberant French-style edifice serves as the Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee Building. Construction of this government building started in 1902 and was finished in 1908, and public entry is prohibited. The details of the architecture are the epitome of the 19c style with the light lemon shade walls and white marble sculptures, pillars and symmetrical corridors. When the lights luminate at night, you will be able to experience a unique ambience. Photography is prohibited in principle, but as long as you take them from a distance, it won't be much of a problem.

Milestone in Vietnam's Liberation Reunification Palace

During French colonial rule, this landmark was the palace of the French governor. Later, under the South Vietnam regime, the palace was the home and office of the president. It is also the historic site where the Republic of Vietnam surrendered when the Army of Democratic Republic of Vietnam crashed through the gates on April 30th, 1975. Being a historic landmark of Vietnam's contemporary history, the palace is a very popular tourist attraction. The building is still used as venues for important government meetings or events, and visitors can also look around the underground bunkers used as operational rooms during the Vietnam War.

Magnificent French Cathedral Nha Tho Duc Ba

A Catholic church first built in 1877 and completed in 1883. The architecture was constructed during the French colonial rule with the materials transported from France. The two tall bell-towers of 19C Neo-Romanesque features and the Virgin Mary statue in the square draw eyes. The statue was once said to shed real tears, attracting public attention. However, the landmark itself seems to be a stereotyped tourist attraction and be overcrowded with visitors, from which we can hardly feel the sacred aura of a cathedral.

Vietnam's Largest Post Office Buu Dien Trung Tam Thanh Pho

The biggest post office in Vietnam, located at the right side of the Notre-Dame Cathedral. The exterior was influenced by the French colonial architecture and is visually striking. The post office provides mailing and international calling services and sells stamps and postcards. Inside, the high arched ceiling similar to that of a European train station is very impressive. At the center, a giant portrait of Vietnam's hero, Ho Chi Minh, hangs proudly on the wall.

Traces of the Vietnam War War Remnants Museum

Tower Overlooking Ho Chi Minh City Saigon Skydeck

The 267m tall 68-storey Bitexco Financial Tower was built in 2010, and the heli pad on the wall of the 52th floor has gained a reputation. The people of Ho Chi Minh City and tourists flock to this skyscraper to look down on the entire city. If you climb to the 49th floor on the elevator that travels with the speed of 7m a second, you will be able to enter the Saigon Skydeck Observatory, where you can see a panoramic view of the exotic landscape of the city.

A Trip to Ho Chi Minh City Suburbs on a Quest for the National Liberation Front

Cu Chi

Cu Chi is located 40km Northwest from central Ho Chi Minh City. The city is known for its thick rubber tree forest, and is very peaceful, but served as a backdrop to intense battles during the Vietnam War. Viet Cong would dig underground tunnels to strike back to the US forces, and two of these tunnels are now open to the public. Ben Duoc, located 70km West from Ho Chi Minh City draws more tourists with a tunnel more than 250km long, featuring four floors and a trench, bedrooms, operational headquarters, kitchen and a hospital. Public entry is permitted for some of the areas so those who wish to enter can experience the tunnel firsthand. A shooting range for live ammunition is also found here, which is why the sound of bullets would make you feel as if you are caught in the crossfires of the Vietnam War. The price for one shot is USD 1.



Location A city in central Jeollabuk-do province, South Korea Area 206.22km² Population 651,990 (as of 2014). Climate Classified as Southern inland climate. In the winter, wind blows to the Northwest due to the Siberian High; in the spring, to the west from migratory anticyclones; in the summer, to the Southeast owing to the North Pacific High. Average annual temperature is 12.9°C with the average temperature of January hovering around -0.6°C, and that of August, around 26.1°C. Average annual precipitation is 1,286mm. Overview The focal point of Jeollabuk-do governance, education and culture, and home to the provincial office. Geographically, Jeollabuk-do can be divided into the Eastern mountains and Western plains with the Noryeong mountain range as the distinction. Jeonju is situated right where the mountains and plains meet.

Type 1. Taking to the Road

Wander out of downtown Jeonju just a bit, and you will be able to experience the beauty of mother nature. The Jeonju zoo, Deokjin Park embracing a lovely pond, and Palbok Arts Factory which cleared the past image of industrial factory, will captivate the hearts and minds of couples.





Romantic Zoo under Raining Petals

Jeonju ZooNot far away from Deokjin Park is a zoo surrounded by cherry

blossom trees. Since opening in June 1978, Jeonju Zoo has been home to around 610 animals of 103 species including tigers, lions, giraffes, hippos, buffaloes, rhinos, camels, chimpanzees, and even endangered species such as Asiatic black bears, zebras and jaguars, which is rare for a rural zoo. During the springtime, when white cherry blossoms start blooming, the zoo is crowded with people. 350 tall cherry blossom trees create a beautiful tunnel, providing couples with a 1.5km long romantic walk. Another popular attraction is the 'Wolves' Forest,' inhabited by four wolves. The roofless cage looks very similar to the canines' natural habitat. The wolves love to hide in holes they dig under trees, which is why you should keep your eyes wide open to catch a good glimpse.

Jeonju's Largest Natural Park Jeonju Deokjin Park

Entering the main gate, Yeonjimoon, you will be welcomed by a statue of a woman dressed beautifully in Hanbok, Korean traditional costume. Deokjin Park is best known for the Yeonhwa Bridge which crosses the Deokjin Lake. 260m long, 1.2m wide and 16m high, the bridge is reportedly the longest in-land suspension bridge in Korea. Once you walk across the wobbly bridge, the 'Yeonhwajeong,' a 3-tier gazebo, awaits you. Each storey offers a magnificent view, making the structure a perfect observatory. In July every year, the 'Jeonju Lotus Flower Festival' is held

at this very park, attracting visitors from all corners of the country. People come flocking to be mesmerized by the elegant appearance and soothing fragrance of lotus flowers. Strolling along the lake, you almost feel as if you are walking on lotus flowers. The 'Yeonjijeong' is definitely the best spot to look down at the carpet of one million luscious lotus flowers topped on a gigantic lake. A musical fountain entertains visitors from April 3rd to October 31st, providing them with extra excitement.

Encounter Taejo Yi Seong-gye Gyeongijeon

Excited the portrait of Taejo Yi Seong-gye, I slowly passed through one gate after another, and finally reached the 'Jeongjeon,' where a group of people were already gathered. The wooden structure atop a stone pillar is where the replica of the king's portrait lies. In 1999, the painter Kwon Oh-chang reproduced the portrait while the original painted on silk in 1872 under the supervision of King Gojong is preserved in the museum of royal portraits. Literally meaning 'a palace built on a blessed site,' the Gyeongijeon is a structure that symbolizes Jeonju, the hometown of Taejo Yi Seong-gye, the great founder of Joseon Dynasty. It was first constructed in 1410 during King Taejong's rule, damaged in 1597 due to the Japanese invasion and restored in 1614. Surrounded by tall green trees and emanating a tranquil ambience, the Gyeongijeon bustles with people dressed in Hanbok.

Art Explosion in an Abandoned Factory Palbok Arts Factory

On March 23rd, a deserted factory situated next to the Palbok-dong railway was brought to life with a burst of art. The abandoned facility for 27 years, previously used to manufacture cassette tapes was purchased by the city of Jeonju and transformed into an arts playground for the people in collaboration with the Jeonju Cultural Foundation. The cassette tape factory 'Sorex' was run from 1979 to 1991, and was considered an eyesore ever since it went out of business. The Palbok Arts Factory still pretty much retains the original structure of the facility, and is comprised of complex 1 and 2 which are exhibition halls, a creative studio used by 13 artists, a café, art shops, a container bridge, and a rooftop playground. The chimney of the factory is used as a signboard, colorful modern art pieces are put up on grey concrete walls, and discarded shipping containers are turned into a bridge that firmly connects two buildings. Around 10 residents of Palbok-dong work at the Arts Factory as docent guides, helping guests better understand art pieces, and as baristas, brewing up a warm cup of coffee.

National Intangible Heritage Center

The National Intangible Heritage Center consists of the 'Yeolinmaru,' or exhibition hall, the 'Olsumaru,' or performance hall, 'Jeonseungmaru,' or training center, 'Sarangchae,' or guesthouse, as well as 'Eoulmaru' and 'Nurimaru,' where international seminars are held. If you have a lot to learn about intangible cultural assets, you should first head to the permanent exhibition hall in Yeonlinmaru. The exhibition venue on the first floor decorated with traditional handmade paper features signature items that represent intangible cultural heritage. The brass rice cooker, traditional alcohol distiller, and special compass used to gravesites or dwelling sites are worth a look. Behind the round-shaped hall, a video of marvelous natural landscapes draws the eye. Make sure not to miss out on the 'Larchiveum,' which opened inside Nurimaru on February 1st .The design of the library was inspired by the favorite picture of KingJeongjo. It has glass walls on three sides, which offer a spectacular view.

Strolling along Gaekridan-gil

The 'ridan-gil' craze sparked in Seoul has now reached Jeonju. 'Gaekridan-gil,' which is a mash-up of 'Jeonju Gaeksa-gil' and 'Gyeongnidan-gil,' is a street created by young shopowners of Jeonju. Idiosyncratic stored are lined up, with no two stores sharing the same concept.

Red-roofed flower shop Hwagonggan ^{花空間}

The antique exterior, as if from a snapshot of an old movie, makes Hwagonggan the most popular photo spot on Gaekridan-qil. The CEO. Jin-won Lee, even placed a bench in front of the store so that tourists could use it as a prop. Mr. Lee set his eves on the all but abandoned red-roofed house on the street, and then he decided to replace the walls with glass and adorned the venue with flowers. What's noticeable is that the renovation was done while retaining the original structure of traditional Japanese-style housing. A huge mirror with vintage wooden frames, an eccentric table with legs made out of a sewing machine, and other vintage objects that accentuate the interior are placed here and there. Flower arrangement classes are available from Wednesday to Saturday. Curriculums vary from 1~2 hour long 1-day courses, a month-long hobby course, 8-session basic course, and 16-session expert course. Flowers of all imaginable colors as well as cotton trees and various herbs are used to create one-of-a-kind items.

Homey café with a snug vibe Café O.doodoo

Café O.doodoo opened right beside the Jeonju Stream on November 2016, and was sought after by many people before Gaekridan-gil earned its current popularity. The owner, Yeonjin Kim used to work as a cooking teacher in Seoul before moving to Jeonju and opening a café on her all-time favorite street, the Metasequoia Road. She furnished the shop herself using bits and bobs she picked up while traveling across the globe. From a window seat, you can view the picturesque landscape of metaseguoia and willow trees lining the Jeoniu Stream. In the fall. Ms. Kim collects the fallen berries under the metasequoia trees and gives them away to guests, as well as selling homemade mini postcards. Shocking fact #1: there are no espresso machines here. The coffee is 100% manual drip, requiring patience, but everyone is happy. Only organic, fair-trade coffee beans are used, enabling a choice between the 'geisha,' with a rich chocolate and honey aroma, harvested from Ethiopia's Bebeka Coffee Plantation, and the 'rainforest,' with a hint of sweet tangerine and wine, directly procured from Ethiopia Gummer.

Makgeolli (Korean rice wine) pub Bangakkan

Bangakkan is a compound of 'flowerlike bang (芳)' and 'clear ah (雅).' The name carries a whimsical connotation of providing flowerlike food and clear Makgeolli to guests. Opened a year ago, Bangakkan is a Makgeolli pub run by Dong-guk Kim and Mun-ioo Bae with an eve-catching retro interior. Their parents' faded wedding pictures and a mini grandfather clock are used as artistic interior props, and a recycled wooden bench provides guests in line with a place to rest. The owner couple has great taste when it comes to picking up witty items. They added accents to plain white walls using discarded wardrobe doors and use 1970s~80s vintage Makgeolli glasses featuring big brand logos. The interior items that bring back the reminiscence warms up people's hearts, and the delicious food satisfies their bellies. The seafood pancake containing a whole squid and 'American cheese potato pancake,' similar to a western pie, are a perfect pair with Makgeolli.



Malaysia

Dreamy, picturesque ocean Mantanani Island, Kota Kinabalu

Snorkeling under the emerald ocean is a definite must when visiting Kota Kinabalu. Most tourists opt for 1-day trips to the Sapi Island, Manukan Island or Mamutik Island which are fairly close by, but for those who prefer a more leisurely schedule, the Mantanani Island, opened to the public in 2004, is highly recommended. About an hour ride by boat, the natural landscape of Mantanani Island is truly a gift from god. The crystal-clear water and beach, carpeted with silky ivory sand, instantly brings peace to your mind. The waters surrounding Mantanani Island are shallow and warm: tailor-made for snorkeling. Here, colorful coral reefs and a myriad of marine life await snorkelers. Boats feature professional snorkeling equipment, and guides are with you every step of the way, so even first-time snorkelers have nothing to be afraid of.








Taiwan

Eco island Xiaoliugiu, Kaohsiung

Xiaoliuqiu, located in South Kaohsiung, is the only coral reef island in Taiwan. Scuba diving and snorkeling are possible year-round, and the island is most famous for swimmers' encounters with sea turtles. Designated an 'eco island,' Xiaoliuqiu places a great importance on environment preservation for sustainable tourism. Creative events are held to engage tourists in the effort, such as giving out 'sand beach coupons' to those who help out with cleaning up the sand beach. 'Sand beach coupons' are pieces of glass featuring drawings of local artists, with which you can get discounts at stores on the island. If you want to enjoy the moment of your life snorkeling with sea turtles in a pristine environment, this is the place. Also, when you're in the waters, don't forget to take a picture with Xioliuqiu's signature landmark, the Vase Rock.



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China's southernmost resort city Xidao Sanya

Sanya is situated at the Southern end of Hainan, China. It is a beloved vacation destination surrounded by 4 bays: Sanya, Dadonghai, Yalong and Haitang bay. The island boasts a warm and moderate climate throughout the year, with a magnificent beach and around 200 hotels and resorts. The best snorkeling spot here would have to be the Xidao island, located near to Sanya, perfect for a day trip. Its shape resembling the back of a turtle, the Xidao island is hardly contaminated due to its distance from the city and is blessed with an ethereal landscape as well as a pristine beach. Most tourists visit the island in order to enjoy water sports, as breathtakingly beautiful coral reefs can be found 10~20m underwater, creating a fascinating coral reef panorama. The island is also known for its romantic sunset, which is an added bonus to the excitement of water activities.







Japan God's residence Kakeroma Kagoshima

Located South to Kyushu island, Kakeroma island boasts a warm weather and dazzling blue ocean. The island is sandwiched in between Kagoshima and Okinawa, falling under the Amami islands, nicknamed 'the Eastern Galapagos' owing to its idiosyncratic ecosystem. A quiet and beautiful island home to around 1000 residents. A gigantic gajumaru tree is an emblem of the island, which is surrounded by 200m tall mountains covered with rainforests. Listening to the sound of the sea waves watching the thick rainforest, you feel as if you're in a paradise left behind by fairies or mythical gods. The crystalline water has a consistent temperature throughout the year, so snorkeling can be enjoyed any season. The island is also famous for being featured in Kawase Naomi's movie <Still the Water>.







Philippines Sanctuary of marine life Batangas Manila

In the Philippines, snorkeling is most often associated with Boracay, Cebu, and Bohol, but Manila has great snorkeling spots that are no less beautiful than these renowned attractions. Meaning 'the oars of a small bamboo boat,' Batangas is located in the Southern part of Manila. Anilao, in particular, is famous for its clear waters and magnificent evening sunset, which makes it a coveted spot for summer houses of Manila's wealthy families. Situated in the North of the Coral Triangle, Batangas is known as a marine oasis, home to 76% of global coral species and more than 3000 different species of fish. Every year, the 'Anilao Underwater Shootout' brings together photographers from across the globe. The place is a good choice not only for snorkeling but also scuba diving. Secret Bay, listed as the world's top 50 diving spots, Sun View, where you can see sea horses, and Coconut Point are some popular spots.







South Korea
Calm and tranquil ocean Yundol Island Geoje

Though little known to the public, there are a number of beautiful snorkeling spots in Geoje. The most popular destination will be Yundol Island, 500m West from Gujora Beach. The island is uninhabited, with 80% of the surface covered in evergreen broad-leaved trees. It is also called the island of devoted sons, as it is told that three brothers of the Yun family built a bridge out of rocks for their mother. The waves are very low and calm, making the island fit for kayaking and snorkeling, even for novices. The snorkeling tour that departs from Mangchi Port starts in July, and is done in small groups so that snorkelers can roam the ocean without bumping into someone else every other second. Not being too well known is a blessing in a way because the island has safeguarded its natural environment 100% intact. Watching diverse marine organisms in Geojue's waters, glistening under the bright sunlight, will surely be an unforgettable experience.



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Everything about Shimonoseki and the Kanmon Strait



Mayor of Shimonoseki Maeda Shintaro

Shimonoseki is a city situated along the Kanmon Strait that flows between Kyushu and Honshu. The city has historically functioned as the hub of land and marine transport, and is renowned as the go-to place for fresh seafood and a magnificent oceanic view, visited by 7 million tourists a year. Here's an interview with Mayor of Shimonoseki, Maeda Shintaro, on the beauty of Shimonoseki and the outlook of the local tourism market.

Could you start by introducing the Shimonoseki?

Situated at the western end of Honshu, Shimonoseki is blessed with Kanmon Strait's beautiful natural landscape and abundant tourism resources including hot springs, which draw 7 million tourists annually. Shimonoseki Port is a longstanding international trade port and current center of port logistics. The city is also the hub of marine transport, which operates regular waterways with Korea and China, and boasts an advanced fisheries industry along with marine transportation and shipbuilding. Shimonoseki is known as the holy land of blowfish, with the downtown area bustling with seafood processing companies and blowfish restaurants. Karato market is famous for fresh sushi, and is beloved by not only locals but also Asian tourists.

What are Shimonoseki's major tourist spots that should not be missed out on?

The most popular attraction would be Karato Market. The market is definitely the best place to visit for a sumptuous meal bustling with street food stalls where locals and tourists enjoy the market's lively and vibrant atmosphere. And one of the major reasons why this place is sought after is the delicious sushi. Fresh sushi can be enjoyed at an affordable price of JPY 100 a piece and you can also choose your favorite sushi while chitchatting with the owners. Right next to the market is the city aquarium, Kaikyokan, which features Japan's largest scale penguin exhibition and the full skeleton of a blue whale. I would also like to recommend Jokamachi Chofu (城下町長府), a place where you can experience a waft of ancient Japan. Situated at the foot of a ruined castle, this town is a cluster of old architecture such as the Kozanji Temple built in 1327, and the Mori Family Mansion, constructed in 1903 by Mori, head of the Chofu clan. The town is perfect for a stroll and is full of beautiful attractions such as streets lined with earthen walls, temples, shrines, traditional houses, and renovated cafes. During the autumn season, the fall foliage is particularly breathtaking, which is why it would be the best time to travel the town.

Where are most of the inbound tourists from?

Korean tourists account for the greatest share, with around 40%. Passenger ships from Korea land at the Shimonoseki Port every morning, and more and more people are traveling through the nearby Kitakyushu Airport. We also have a large number of Chinese and Taiwanese tourists coming in, and many Chinese visitors are arriving on cruise ships from 2017 onwards. The total number of inbound tourists via cruise ships last year is around 105,000.

How about the number of inbound foreign travelers and the latest tourism trends?

The number of foreign tourists staying the night in Shimonoseki is on the rise. Over the past 5 years, the figure increase from 9857 in 2013 to 19,301 in 2017. It is easy to find individual travelers from East Asia at major tourist spots, all thanks to the launch of LCC routes to Kitakyushu Airport and Fukuoka Airport in the vicinity of Shimonoseki. In line with the surge in inbound foreign tourists, we are trying to install more signposts in foreign languages around city restaurants, stores and tourist attractions





What are the best values Shimonoseki has to offer to foreign tourists?

Shimonoseki's best tourism resources are seafood and the magnificent ocean view. You can enjoy freshly caught seafood everywhere in Shimonoseki including the Karato market. Furthermore, Shimonoseki's blowfish (fugu) has become a well-known brand in Japan. Shimonoseki and blowfish are instantly associated with each other, and this year marks the 130th year since blowfish was recognized as an edible fish in Shimonoseki. The city continues its long history of blowfish dishes with sashimi, sushi, nabe, and even sake. I would also like to urge you to visit Tsunoshima, a place with a splendid view of the ocean. It is a small island of only 1000 residents and is known as a scenic spot in Japan. It appeared as a backdrop to movies and TV ads, and the bridge that cuts across the cobalt blue sea is so beautiful that many tourists come to see it in person.

Many cities worldwide consider tourism the backbone of their economy. What efforts are Shimonoseki putting in for overseas marketing?

We consider countries geographically close to Japan such as Korea, China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Thailand as important markets. If travel fairs or expos are hosted in these countries, we visit them to exchange information. Moreover, under the idea that tourists to Japan will not only travel Shimonoseki but visit other districts as well, we are collaborating with other regions such as Yamaguchi Prefecture and Chugoku region, or relevant organizations. We are taking part in the Inland Sea, 'Setouchi Tourism Authority', a body centered on the promotion of Seto Inland Sea, to assist joint field surveys and news reporting. Last year, we researched and analyzed foreign tourists' travel pattern and preferences jointly with Kitakyushu.

What is the largest tourism event held in Shimonoseki?

Shimonoseki has 3 main festivals. The first is the 'Shimonoseki Strait Festival,' inspired by a historic battle that took place in 1185. Women dressed in extravagant kimonos march the street, and a grand maritime parade that recreates the battle draws eyes. Secondly, we host the 'Kanmon Strait Firework Festival' where 15,000 fireworks explode above the Kanmon Strait. Last but not least, there's the 'Shimonoseki Bakan (馬関) Festival.' It is the largest summer festival, where the streets are full of night food

stalls and crowds. The Heike (平家) dance, where 4,000 dancers create an outstanding performance on the last day of the festival, is not to miss.

What plans do you have in mind for the future development of Shimonoseki's tourism industry?

We will be developing the waterfront area around Kanmon Strait to attract more tourists. Recently, we see an increased preference for experience-centered tourism among foreign visitors. We thus aim to leverage the competitive edge of Shimonoseki's farming and fishing villages to push forward with Green•Blue Tourism. In other words, we will provide tourists with a chance to experience the natural environment of rural towns, and help them connect with locals.

A final few words for TPO please?

As more and more tourists visit the Asia Pacific region each year, I believe local authorities are redoubling their efforts to draw more tourists to their shores. I look forward to advancing both the inbound and outbound market through active collaboration and exchange among TPO member countries.

K-CLIP 2018 Held in Success

Organized by the Tourism Promotion Organization for Asia Pacific Cities (TPO), hosted by Jeonju city and sponsored by Gunsan, Iksan, Jeollabuk-do, Andong, Ganghwa-gun, and Goyang, 'K-CLIP 2018' was successfully held from the 6th to 17th of August. CLIP is held every year in one of TPO member cities in order to provide young talents with an opportunity to increase their understanding on host cities' culture, language and tourism resources. This year's event, which took place in Jeonju, brought together 42 participants from 9 countries including Malaysia, Vietnam, China, US, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, the Philippines, and Taiwan.

At the opening ceremony held on the 7th of August, Kim Seong-su, mayor of Jeonju and Shin Yeonsung, Secretary-General of TPO, extended their welcome to the participants. The welcoming remarks were followed by special lectures on Korea's unique identity and culture embodied by the city of Jeonju, such as Korean traditional housing (Hanok), handmade paper (Hanji), and cuisine (Hansik). In addition, classes were given for the participants to learn about Korea's epic chant (Pansori), by adding shouts of encouragement (Chuimsae) in other languages. Participants also toured around traditional education institutions including the Jeonju Hyanggyo and Jeonju Traditional Culture Training Institute. In addition, they were offered a chance to hear about and experience firsthand Jeonju's history and culture at the Hanok Village and Gyeonggijeon. From the 8th to 10th, the program was centered on making Jeonju bibimbap and kimchi, learning traditional etiquettes, and visiting the National Intangible

Heritage Center exhibitions as well as the Jeonju National Museum. On the evening of the 10th, participants enjoyed local beer at the 4th Jeonju Gamaek Festival, and they had FAM TOUR in some of TPO member cities from the 11th to 17th.

On the first day of FAM TOUR, participants paid a visit to Mireuksa Temple Site, Kosrak and Prison Filming Site in Iksan, after which they headed to Gunsan to look around vestiges of the modern age such as the Time Travelers' Town and Railroad Town. They also had a chance to take part in the opening ceremony of '2018 Gunsan Night Walk Festival,' an amalgamation of Gunsan's beautiful nightscape and cultural heritage. On the second day, the group visited Imsil-gun and Namwon with the support of Jeollabuk-do provincial office. In Imsil, the Cheese Theme

Park provided a memorable experience of making cheese and tasting it, and in Namwon, participants were able to dabble in Pansori and Gayageum, then tour around art galleries and the Gwanghalluwon Garden. The guests were particularly happy to stay the night at a Hanok hotel in Namwon. The schedule for the third day was to travel to Andong and visit the Hahoe Mask Museum, as well as to watch a special Hahoe Mask dance performance. The team then traveled to Ganghwa-gun on the fourth day, where they went stomping on a mudflat, and enjoyed night luge rides in the evening.

The last stop was the city of Goyang. The group started off the first day by partaking in the launching ceremony of Goyang Tourism Supporters and paid a visit to Hyundai Motor Studio and One Mount on the following day. At One Mount, participants took K-POP dance classes to indulge in K-culture and went sledding in Snow Park. At the closing ceremony held in Kintex, head of Goyang New Korean Wave Tourism Division, Hee-sung Yoon, Goyang Convention Bureau staff member, Head of Jeongu Tourism Industry Team, Yeong-ho Cho, and Director General of TPO, Dal-ryeo Jo, offered their congratulations. The participants divided into five groups gave presentations under the theme 'Korea through my eyes,' to share their 12-day experience in Korea with the rest of the audience.

Dalian, China | September 14~16 Location Dalian World Expo Center

A national expo jointly hosted by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China and Dalian Municipal People's Government. Shimonoseki, Japan I September 21~26


Location Kanmon Strait (departs from Karato Pier)
